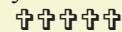

Dear Friends in Christ,



Once again, we are off to another new goal for the House of Charity for 2014! The assigned goal for our parish is \$132,600.00. That is \$2,600.00 over last year's goal. Our parish is so generous and our goal was met last year on the backs of a rather few of our parishioners. It would be so great not to have to keep at you week after week. I am sure you tire of hearing from me. Please consider getting your donation in early; let's make our goal and then I will leave you alone on this matter. Our Holy Father offers us in his 2014 Lenten message: "Material destitution is what is normally called poverty, and affects those living in conditions opposed to human dignity: those who lack basic rights and needs such as food, water, hygiene, work and the opportunity to develop and grow culturally. In response to this destitution, the Church offers her help, her diaconia, in meeting these needs and binding these wounds which disfigure the face of humanity. In the poor and outcast we see Christ's face; by loving and helping the poor, we love and serve Christ." Let us see our offering to the House of Charity as an offering to Jesus Himself. The theme for the House of Charity this year is *Unearthing the Treasure*. Jesus tells us that "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." (Mt. 6:21). 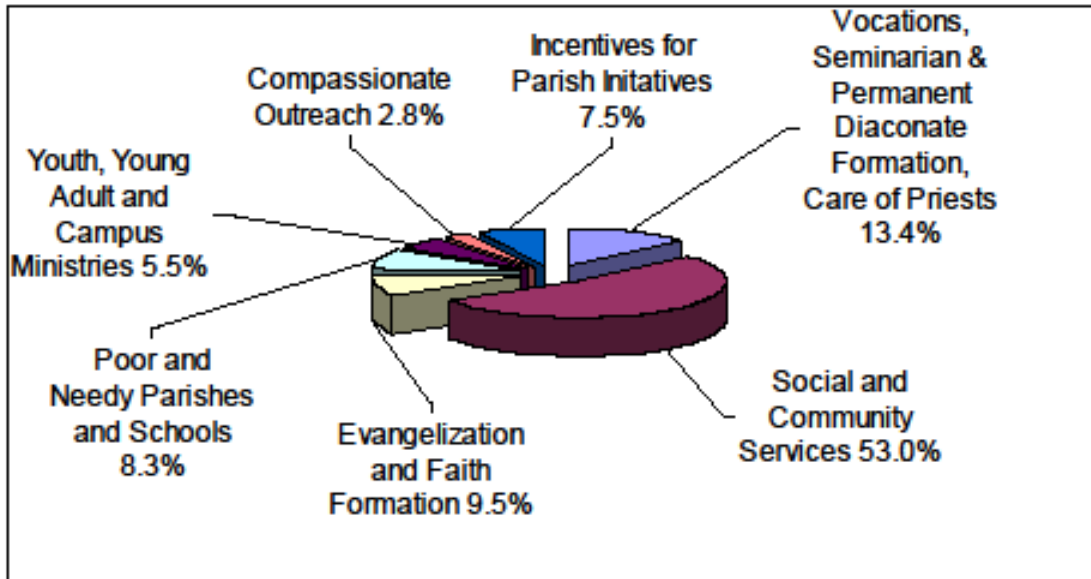
