Dear Friends in Christ,



We continue these Sundays to have the Bread of Life discourse, the Sixth Chapter of Saint John, offered for our meditation. We are encouraged to once again appreciate the Bread of Life. Jesus tells us unless you eat this bread and drink this cup you cannot have eternal life. Could he be any clearer? In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1373-1374, we read "Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us," is present in many ways to his Church: in his word, in his Church's prayer, "where two or three are gathered in my name," in the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, in the sacraments of which he is the author, in the sacrifice of the Mass, and in the person of the minister. But "he is present. . . most especially in the Eucharistic species." The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as "the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend." In the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist "the Body and Blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, *the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained.*" This presence is called 'real' - by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a *substantial* presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present." *Aggie Catholic Blog* reported, "ISIS announced the execution of twenty-one Copts but only twenty names were confirmed, most of them were from the province of Minya (Upper Egypt). There was an inaccuracy in the number of Egyptian Hostages; there were only twenty Egyptians (Copts). Then who was this remaining one non-Coptic victim? *Ahram-Canadian News* was able to gather information about this man. He was a Chadian Citizen who accepted Christianity after seeing the immense faith of his fellow Coptic Christians to die for Christ. When Terrorist forced him to reject Jesus Christ as God, looking at his Christian friends he replied, "Their God is my God" so the terrorist beheaded him also." Christians are dying for the faith; they risk their lives to receive the Holy Sacrament. What do we choose over God? Vacation? Sports? Practices? Recitals? Sleeping in? One really loses their head when he chooses any thing over the Lord Jesus Christ! Do we really deserve such a loving and merciful God?

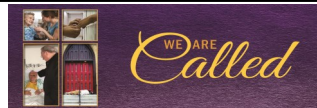

40 Days of Francis Begins!

Pope Francis quote of the week: “Among our tasks as witnesses to the love of Christ is that of giving a voice to the cry of the poor.”

Knot of the week: Over 190,000 people in the Diocese of Camden lack consistent access to adequate food. That's 14% of the Diocese's total population.

This Monday, August 17, will mark exactly 40 days until the arrival of Pope Francis in Philadelphia on September 26. Forty days is a number of great religious significance. It's the number of years Moses and the Israelites wandered the desert; it's the number of days Jesus fasted and prayed before beginning his public ministry; and it's the number of days Catholics spend preparing for Jesus' Passion, death and resurrection during Lent. During these 40 Days of Francis, Catholic Charities invites you to prepare for the coming of this Pope of and for the poor by “encountering” the reality of poverty in the Diocese of Camden.

After Mass this weekend, you will find “knots” at the back of the Church that you can take home with you. These knots, inspired by Pope Francis' devotion to Our Lady, Undoer of Knots, represent the knots of poverty so many in South Jersey face. We invite you to come visit the Catholic Charities center near you to learn how we as a Catholic community respond to these issues and help untie the knots. Next week, we will hold open houses at all of our centers throughout the Diocese of Camden. We're looking forward to seeing you!
