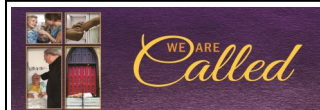

Registration Forms are due by Aug. 31st. We cannot guarantee books and materials will be available for your child at the Open House if forms are received past Aug. 31st.

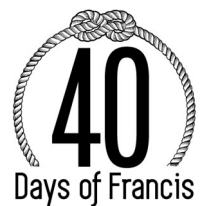
40 Days of Francis: Day 34
