

Dear Friends in Christ,



A very important aspect of one's life with God is spiritual reading. There are so many good books, real spiritual classics that would be good to read. Naturally, Sacred Scripture is beyond

spiritual reading for the Word of God is not mere literature, but inspired by the Holy Spirit. The Church Fathers have totally turned people's lives around. Books such as *Story of a Soul* by Saint Terese of Lisieux or *Interior Castle* by Saint Teresa of Avila are wonderful. Works by Saint Francis de Sales provide rich spiritual direction. Stories about saints, even American saints, such as Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton or Saint John Neumann would be most beneficial. Anything by G.K. Chesterton is both enjoyable and edifying as are the writings of Ronald Knox. Novels by Evelyn Waugh, perhaps *Brideshead Revisited* or *Edmund Campion* could be on the list. Books by Fyodor Dostoyevsky lead one into the Eastern tradition. Flannery O'Connor is a great American Catholic writer along with anything by J.F. Powers who wrote one my favorites: *Morte D'Urban*. Very powerful novels are *The Screwtape Letters* by CS Lewis, *Shoes of the Fisherman* by Morris West and *A Man for All Seasons* by Robert Bolt. So many enjoyed the *Lord of the Rings* movie series, read the books by J.R.R. Tolkien. *Black Robe* by Brian Moore or *The Keys of the Kingdom* by A.J. Cronin are edifying. Obviously, these mentioned are not even the tip of the iceberg. The important thing is to read and to consume good works that nourish the soul. A Catholic should read more than *Vogue* or *Sports Illustrated*. Choose something good and challenging this fall. Is it tough to read? Good! Stick with it and reap the benefits.


