**COME LET US ADORE HIM**

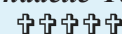

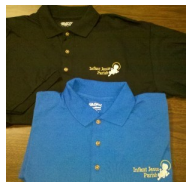

## Suggestions for Praying

There are many different styles, forms, and levels of prayer. You could ask 50 different people how to pray and would probably get 50 different variations as answers. In this part, we will try to keep things very simple.

Some people are uncertain of how to pray or possibly have had very little experience in praying at all. At this time, we are going to address this level.

First and foremost, remember prayer is your personal communication with God. Much like you would communicate to a family member or friend, you communicate with God. Yet, to Him, we talk with reverence. It is very important to remember whom it is that you are praying to!

It is also very important to allow your heart to get involved in the prayer not just your brain. Involving our heart allows Love to become involved. The more Love becomes involved, the more our faith grows because God is Love!

Try to set aside a time to pray while you are calm and relaxed. For many, morning or evening prayer is the best because at that time things are quiet. Then, give yourself a length of time to pray, if just a couple minutes is all you feel comfortable with, that's okay. The main thing is you're praying! Many people have found there is tremendous value in prayer that they never knew existed prior to starting.

Remember: Prayer is not magic. We can pray with the greatest of intentions for the greatest causes, and not see the results we anticipated. Certainly not in the time frame we imagined. This should not keep us from praying. Many times, God's will is different than ours. Sometimes our prayers won't be answered and we won't understand why. Sometimes our prayers won't appear to be answered. Many times our prayers will be answered, yet in a way we never imagined. So again don't stop praying. We must learn to trust that God knows and wants what is best for us.

When you pray, ask for all your intentions through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Read the Bible, it is a great way to pray and to learn how to pray. The Gospels have Jesus teaching those around him how to pray, and those teachings apply perfectly for us as well. The Psalms are another great way to learn to pray as we reflect on the prayers of David while he prays to God. These are two great places to start.
