Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We are living in a world in which our own lives and the lives of our loved ones are surrounded by so many uncertainties, so many things can go astray at anytime and at any moment. The only thing that can give us peace of mind and keep us strong is as Jesus said praying always. In Today's Gospel, Jesus taught his disciples how to pray by teaching them the "Lord's Prayer". Every one of



us seems to memorize this prayer by heart, and very often we just rush through it without giving any thought or reflection at all. When we pray the "Our Father", we should keep in mind that this prayer was not written or spoken by a human being, but rather it was spoken and taught by God Jesus Christ. For this reason, St. Thomas Aquinas called it a "Perfect Prayer", perfect since it came from the mouth of God and a pattern for all prayers. There are seven petitions in the "Our Father Prayer".

First petition: "Hollowed be Thy name", God's name must be praised and gloried above all, since in the Name of God everything in heaven and on earth was created and redeemed, every prayer must recognize and revere His Name. Second petition: "Thy kingdom come" we pray for God's kingdom, His words, to reach the eyes, the ears, and the

heart of every person around the world.

Third petition: "Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven", we pray that nothing on earth should go against God's will as it does in heaven, that everyone should accept God's will in his or her life and live it faithfully.

Fourth petition: "Give us this day our daily bread", in this petition, we ask God to give us the divine nourishment for both body and soul, especially for the salvation of our souls.

Fifth petition: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us", remember, when we ask God to forgive us our sins, in the mean time, we must forgive others as well. God cannot forgive us, if deep down in our hearts, we don't have mercy and forgiveness.

Sixth petition: "Lead us not into temptation", everyday we are struggling with various temptations, as St. Paul said: "The thing that I don't want to do, I do it; and the thing that I want to do, I don't do". We need the divine help to strengthen us not give in into temptation as Jesus said: "Without me, you can do nothing".

Seventh petition: "But deliver us from evil", every sin, venial or mortal, damages our relationship with God and others. It eventually leads to destruction and the death of the soul, only God can deliver us from evil of eternal damnation. Let us pray the "Our Father" slowly and attentively as we are praying the words of God and not the words of man.




