YOUTH MASS

The liturgy for this Mass is intended for our young people who will be involved in the liturgy of Lector and Music. Everyone is invited to attend and to show your support for our Family and Youth Ministry.

ANNUAL COMMISSIONING OF LITURGICAL MINISTERS

We invite those who are currently involved in the Liturgy of the Eucharist: Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Music Ministers, Cantors, Ushers, and Altar Servers, to attend one of the weekend Masses, on the weekend of November 26th (Christ the King Sunday) either at St. John Vianney Church or St. Margaret Church. During the Mass, you will be commissioned or recommissioned as Ministers of the Eucharistic Liturgy.

CAP We can be sure that we love God's children when we love God and do what He has commanded. 1 John 5:2

The Office of Child and Youth Protection is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the Diocese of Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years.

<u>CAP 1</u> teaches attendees to **recognize child abuse and neglect** and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees.

<u>CAP 2</u> is called <u>CAP's Bullying Prevention Program</u> and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented.

<u>CAP 3</u> is called <u>Cyber-Empowerment</u> and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere.

Each presentation is 90 minutes. Adults who are new employees or volunteers should attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1, 2 or 3 when they renew their CAP.

CAP Phase 1 - Wednesday, November 15, 7:00 PM, St. Rose of Lima, Haddon Heights; Thursday, November 16, 2:00 PM, Catholic Charities (Training Room), Camden.

CAP Phase 2 - Tuesday, November 21, 7:00 PM, St. Charles Borromeo, Sicklerville

CAP Phase 3 - Wednesday, November 15, 7:00 PM, Assumption, Galloway; Monday, November 27, 7:00 PM, Holy Eucharist Parish, Cherry Hill.




