Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we come near the end of this calendar year, we also celebrate Christ the King Sunday which is the Pastor's Desk last Sunday of the liturgical year. We adore Jesus Christ Our Lord the King of the universe since He is the creator of the whole universe and redeemer of humanity. Unlike the earthly kings, Jesus Christ is the King of love, the King who came into the world not to live but to die so that his subjects might live, the King who came not to condemn but to redeem, the King who came not to be served but to serve, for this reason, we call him the King above all other kings. When asked by Pilate "Are you the King of the Jews?" in today's Gospel, Jesus replied: "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here." Through baptism, we are redeemed and sealed by Christ the King's blood and so we no longer belong to this earthly kingdom but belong to the Kingdom promised by Jesus Christ. This earthly kingdom is here today and gone tomorrow, all its "treasure and glory" are fading away and eventually will turn into "nothingness"; whereas the Kingdom in which we belong is coming and having no end. Every one of us have to choose one; either to live our lives according to this earthly kingdom or the Kingdom to come, to be so attached and blinded by the things which are here today and gone tomorrow or the things that last forever. It is easy to fall into the temptation of defining ourselves based on our social status, wealth, or any "glories" of this world. These things do not make up our identities, rather our identities are truly rooted in our Baptismal status. Our "wealth" is our faith and moral truths taught by Jesus our King, and ultimately our glory is the everlasting life and happiness awaiting us in the Kingdom to come where our Lord Jesus Christ is the King of Kings, Lord of Lords and reigns forever and ever amen! -Fr. 

Community Service Opportunity: Conduct a neighborhood food drive to help fill the food pantry.

Food drives are extremely important to the St. Vincent de Paul Society and those we serve. They help fill the gaps of foods that are not frequently donated. You can make a difference. Your efforts to organize and conduct a food drive will provide nutritious, high quality food for your neighbors in

need and help with your community service hours.

Hunger doesn't take a holiday. While the holidays are typically the time when most lend a helping hand, hunger is a year-round issue for many in our area. NOW is the perfect time for your food drive.

Most Needed Items:

High-Protein: meat (ham, spreads, stews, chicken); fish (tuna, salmon, sardines); vegetarian (nuts, seeds, peanut butter and other nut butters, and beans)

Dairy: evaporated and powdered milk; puddings and custards; infant formula (plastic containers only)

Fruits & Vegetables: canned fruit, canned vegetables, 100% fruit and vegetable juices, soups, sauces, and condiments.

Breads & Cereals: breakfast cereals, rice, pasta, and muffin/bread mixes.

Household Goods: (must be kept separate from food donations) diapers, paper products, and cleaning supplies and detergents.

Please Note: We cannot accept previously opened containers, repackaged and homemade items, products dated 2005 or earlier, perishables (i.e. breads, pies, cakes, produce (fresh or frozen), glass bottles/containers, or aluminum soda cans.

Attached: Is a sample of the flyer that can be attached to a plastic bag and given to neighbors with the information for collection. Bag can be brought to the rectory for placement in the food pantry.
