As we are entering a Holy Season, the Season of Advent, we are called to reflect upon the mystery of the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. The Immanuel means God-with-

us and is profoundly described by St. Augustine as: "God became man so that men would become God". This profound theological statement means God emptied himself so that he would be able to unite himself to our human nature and, by virtue of this union, humanity became "part of God". So as guilty and sinful as humanity was, however, being united to the divine nature of God at the Incarnation, is beyond our human imagination and understanding. What a profound mystery of love that humanity would never be able to grasp. Advent is indeed a time for us to take a sincere look at our lives to see "where we are at", whether we are separated from his loving union, "half way", or "lukewarm union". The word Advent means "waiting", not that we are waiting for the celebration of the birth of Christ; but rather Christ is waiting for us to be "reunited" with him, to come back to him, to be reconciled with him, to be part of his family, his loving union. The Season of Advent is nothing else but an anticipation of longing and thirsting for "God became me so that I might become God". Jesus was there, is there, and will be there waiting for us in the Mass, in our prayers, in the Sacrament of reconciliation, in husbands, wives, mothers, fathers, sons, daughters, sisters, brothers, and those in need. Let us take advantage of this longing Season to return to Jesus' loving union prepared for us at the mystery of the Incarnation. *-Fr. Joe Pham*
