Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Gospel today tells us that, when observing the people putting money into the temple's treasury, Pastor's Desk Jesus noticed a poor widow who made a contribution of only "two small coins"; however, in the eyes of Jesus, she contributed "her whole livelihood". Jesus did not praise the amount of the widow's offering; he praised the "amount" of her sacrificial heart. This weekend, we celebrate the "National Vocation Awareness Week", we pray to our High Priest, Jesus Christ, asking for more young men and women to offer their whole lives and hearts for the mission of continuing the redemptive work of Christ in the Church through the Priesthood and Religious Life. In the meantime, we also pray for the sanctification and holiness of the clergy especially during this time of scandalous crisis in the church. The Church of Christ now more than ever needs more holy and morally good Priests who would love and care for the sheep instead of ruining, destroying, or inflicting pain and scars on the sheep's lives. As believers in Christ and the members of His Mystical Body, the Church, we pray together, we suffer together, and we offer our penance together for the sanctification of all members of the church. As St. Francis prayed at site of the ruined church in his town, he heard a voice coming from the cross telling him "rebuild my church". Like the poor widow, St. Francis offer his "whole livelihood" to rebuild Christ's church through his prayers, humility, and mortification. Today, Jesus needs more holy men and women to rebuild his church by joining the Priesthood and Religious life, he needs all the faithful clergy and laity come together to rebuild his church, not by bricks or mortars, but by holiness, faithfulness, and humility. -Fr. 
