As today's Gospel tells us that while Jesus was journeying to Jerusalem in order to fulfill his redemptive mission, someone approached Jesus and said: "I will follow you wherever you



go". Instead of responding: "please come following me", Jesus said: "Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head". As disciples of Christ, we long to be with him when we come to an end of this earthly journey, we long to live with him for all eternity in his heavenly kingdom. However, in order to fulfill this longing, we have no other way except following the way of Jesus, following him "wherever he goes". Meanwhile, we must understand and recognize that Jesus himself "has no place here", he does not belong to this earthly kingdom, his kingdom is the everlasting kingdom in heaven. Indeed, we too, we live in this life but we do not belong to this life, we belong to Christ's heavenly kingdom. Jesus wanted to remind us that this earthly life is a journey to the heavenly homeland; therefore ones should not be so attached to or be "swallowed up" in worldly things and neglecting or forgetting the things of heaven. There is a very common and "clever" temptation within us. We try to spend our whole life to work and to find any means to secure and satisfy this earthly life while our eternal life is being neglected and even forgotten. Like the other two in today's Gospel who had excuses for not following Jesus: "Let me go first and bury my father" and "Lord, I will follow you, but first let me say farewell to my family", we too often find all kinds of excuses for not praying everyday, not attending Sunday Mass, not doing any act of charity, not helping those in need, not ready to forgive, not ready to turn away from sin, etc. When Jesus said: "Let the dead bury their dead" and "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God", he gave these two men a sense of urgency: "let's do it now". Let us "do it now", let us spend more time in worship, prayer, and in concerning for things that are eternal. As we celebrate the birth of our country on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, let us also celebrate our "independence" from this worldly allurement as well. -Fr. Joe Pham



## New Jersey Independent Victims Compensation Program

The Diocese of Camden – along with the other Roman Catholic dioceses in New Jersey – has established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as children or young adults, were sexually abused by a priest of the Diocese.



The IVCP is independently administered by experienced victim compensation experts Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros.

The IVCP will handles the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and operates independently of the Diocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be independently determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims – no matter when the abuse occurred – are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially.

Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to <u>www.njdiocesesivcp.com</u> and reviewing the protocol for submitting a claim.

Bishop Sullivan strongly encourages anyone who was sexually victimized by a priest of the Diocese to participate in the IVCP, and has asked that anyone who knows of someone who was abused to contact them so that they are aware of the IVCP and can participate in it.

# ST. MARGARET & ST. JOHN VIANNEY CHURCHES PROJECT UPDATE

Dear Parishioners,

I would like to inform you about some changes regarding St. Margaret Church renovations. On January 30<sup>th</sup>, 2019, everyone was invited to attend the meeting to discuss the renovations of St. Margaret Church. At the meeting, we decided to refurbish the existing pews, replace the kneelers, the deteriorating carpets in the Church and Chapel, the main wooden Sanctuary with marble as well as the center aisle and the vestibule with porcelain floor tile and add seat cushions on the pews. The total cost for this project is **\$196,900.00**.

However, due to not achieving our Catholic Strong Goal, I called for a special meeting on May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019 which included the Parish and Finance Councils as well as the Building and Grounds Committee to reconsider the cost of this project. After carefully reviewing the cost of the project and the reality of the Catholic Strong fund, they recommended <u>cutting back the unnecessary costs which were the pew</u> <u>cushions, the Sanctuary marble floor, and the porcelain floor tile in the center aisle.</u> Therefore, we will now proceed with refurbishing the pews, replacing the kneelers, carpeting the whole Church, Chapel, porcelain tile the vestibule floor, and repairing and refurbishing the wooden Sanctuary floor. This plan will cost \$145,965.00.

This summer we hope to accomplish these much needed repaired-projects:

- 1- Paving St. John Vianney parking lot @ a cost of \$31,000.00
- 2- Replacing St. John Vianney Church carpet @ a cost of \$20,000.00
- 3- St. Margaret Church interior Renovations @ a cost of \$145,965.00
