Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



In today's Gospel, Jesus was asked by the Pharisees whether they should pay the census tax to Caesar or not? Jesus responded: "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied: "Caesar's". Then Jesus said to them: "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God".

By saying this, Jesus was referring to Caesar as the "earthly things", the things that we spend our whole lives to labor for such as: shelter, food, clothing, career, social status, fame, wealth, etc. These things seem to occupy all our time and drain all our energy to the point that we feel so exhausted at the end of the day. The problem is that we often "over repay" what belongs to "Caesar", and fail to "repay" what is due to God.

Remember, we are created by God and made in His image and likeness; thus our whole person, "body and soul", belongs to God. Meanwhile, our souls have also been imprinted with an indelible mark, the (inscription) of the Blessed Trinitarian love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Everyday, there are so many ways and so many opportunities for each of us to repay what belongs to God. November is Catholic Cemetery Month, a time when we remember, honor and pray for all of the faithful departed. Given the COVID-19 pandemic and hardship felt by all, we are happy to announce the temporary suspension of our restriction on solar lights. Hence, we invite families to place a solar light at their loved one’s grave or outside of the mausoleum for those entombed indoors to honor them in a special way during the month of November. We want to particularly recognize those lost this year, notably those lost during the time of state-mandated restricted gatherings. Additionally, we pray for those who died alone and for their families who, because of the pandemic, were not allowed to be with their loved ones at the time of their passing. We ask that you please remove the solar lights by December 1, 2020.

We encourage our families to visit our cemeteries and mausoleums and to pray for their dearly departed loved ones and all souls who have gone before us. In honor of All Souls Day, all diocesan managed chapel mausoleums will be open from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM on Monday, November 2, 2020.
