Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



In today's Gospel, Jesus foretold what would happen to him on Good Friday and why it must happen: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruits".

Jesus must suffer (fall to the ground) and sacrifice his life (die on the cross) for us so that the "grain" of his love would be able to grow in our hearts. As disciples of Christ, we too are called to imitate Jesus' "fall to the ground and die" so that our love for others would bear much fruits.

For us "fall to the ground" means willing to suffer for the truths and righteousness taught by Jesus Christ. The truth helps us to recognize our creator and redeemer, the truth compels us to love everyone, even our enemies, since all are created in the image and likeness of God. The truth asks us to forgive so that we, ourselves, would be forgiven, the truth sets us free from the deception and delusion of worldly allurements, and ultimately, the truth leads us to righteousness which is just and holy in God's eyes.

However; we cannot live these truths taught by Christ in our lives and be righteous in his eyes unless the hills of our egos "fall to the ground". As Jesus, "the grain of wheat", died on the cross for us so that the fruit of salvation would be produced for us, so we too are called to live a productive life by using our love as a means to gain righteousness or holiness before God.

True love always requires sacrifice since, without sacrifice, it is "love of oneself" which is impossible to bear fruits. Let husbands and wives, parents and children, brothers and sisters, friends and neighbors be a "grain of wheat" which "falls to the ground and dies" for one another so that the "fruits" of love and righteousness would be produced for our loved ones and for others. 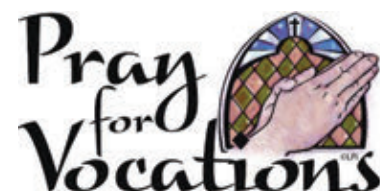
WORLDWIDE MARRIAGE ENCOUNTER

- The elderly and families with young children (who may find it difficult to maintain a six-foot distance from others) are encouraged to stay home.
- **Holy Communion will be distributed on Sundays at St. Margaret Church at 11:15 AM for those who watch Mass on Live-Stream** and would like to receive Holy Communion.
- **The faithful should wear cloth face coverings** when in public, including when they come to church. Young children under the age of 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or anyone otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance does not need to wear a face covering.
- The faithful should maintain a 6-foot distance from each other at all times except members of a single household.
