Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the profound mystery of our faith, the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, three distinct Persons but only One God. Jesus Himself revealed this nature of God to us when commissioning His disciples: "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Go therefore to make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spir-



The Blessed Trinity is indeed a mystery that our human mind cannot grasp or understand; however it does not mean that we have no clue about the mystery of the Blessed Trinity. Through Jesus's revelation, we come to know one thing for certain, that is love, the love that "makes" them three distinct Persons, One God. Three of Them: God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, constantly love each other so much so that nothing can separate them into "three gods".

This Trinitarian love was being shared in God's creation from the very beginning. Out of this Trinitarian love, we were created and, for this Trinitarian love, we are called to share and to live. Indeed every "form/ level/degree" of love comes from the love of the Blessed Trinity. The highest "form/level/degree" of love can be found in the Sacrament of Matrimony which reflects the Trinitarian love clearly and vividly. The image of the Blessed Trinity formulates the love within the family: the love between husband, wife, and children and also between children, mother, and father. Each human family is truly formed and reflect the image of the Blessed Trinity.

Therefore, whenever we celebrate the Blessed Trinity, we are reminded not so much to reflect upon the "Three Persons but only One God"; but rather we are called to reflect upon and to renew the Trinitarian love within our families. The love between husband, wife, parents and children must be constant, dynamic, inseparable, and indissoluble, the love that binds all family members into one heart, one body, one mind, and one spirit as it is reflected in the mystery of the Blessed Trinity. -Fr. New Directives Regarding the Lifting of COVID-19 Restrictions

The following guidelines are issued for the Diocese of Camden:

LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS – Beginning on Friday, May 28th, the faithful participating in Mass, who are vaccinated against COVID-19, are no

longer required to wear masks. Those who are not yet vaccinated are encouraged to wear masks in accord with CDC guidelines. No one should be challenged in regard to this policy. All pews may be opened for seating, all social distancing requirements are lifted for celebrations that take place in the parish church(es). **Beginning on Friday, June 4th**, parishes may return to full capacity for seating. All ministries may return to full service - altar servers, lectors, ushers, greeters and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Altar servers under the age of 12 should wear masks since they are not yet eligible for vaccination. Ushers may take up the offertory collection at the proper time and the procession to present the gifts of bread and wine is to be resumed. The invitation to share the Sign of Peace is likewise restored – it is not necessary that the faithful shake hands as there are other ways to offer the Sign of Peace or those present may choose to do so only with their immediate relatives. The distribution of Holy Communion is to be returned to its proper place within the Communion Rite, but the Precious Blood is not to be distributed to the faithful at this time. Parishes must continue to be vigilant about cleaning commonly touched surfaces.

Priests, deacons and Extraordinary Ministers of Communion should not only wash their hands before and after Mass, but should use hand sanitizer immediately before the distribution of Holy Communion.

STATEMENT OF THE NEW JERSEY BISHOPS Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass

At this time, due to the observance of public safety protocols and the increase in the availability of vaccines, we have begun a return to some sense of normalcy in various sectors of our society.

Therefore, we the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation beginning on *Saturday*, *June 5*, *2021*, *and Sunday*, *June 6*, *2021*, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law canon 1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).


This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult the local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).

Finally, safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives (communion in the hand, communion under one species, etc.) in each New Jersey Diocese remains in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.

Infant Jesus Parish will continue to live-stream the 4 PM Mass on Saturdays for the sick and homebound ONLY.

UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT FOR THE DISTRICT OF NEW JERSEY

In re The Diocese of Camden, New Jersey Case No. 20-21257 (JNP)

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on October 1, 2020, The Diocese of Camden, New Jersey, (the "Diocese") filed for protection under Chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United States Code.

The Bankruptcy Court has established June 30, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. (prevailing Eastern time) as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Diocese (the "Bar Date").

If you have a claim against the Diocese including, without limitation, a claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date with Prime Clerk, the appointed Claims Agent.
