Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



Today's Gospel tells us the story of a rich man who ran up to Jesus asking him a question: "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Looking at him, Jesus said: "You know the commandments: You shall not kill, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not bear false witness, you shall not defraud, honor your father and mother." However, the rich man had already kept these commandments: "Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth." Then Jesus told him: "You are lacking in one thing: Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven". At this command, the rich man failed to fulfill: "At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions".

The reason why this rich man failed to carry out the "lacking in one thing" that Jesus told him to do because he had kept the Ten Commandments just for the sake of the "letter of law" and not for the "law of love". As Christians, Jesus wants us to keep his commandments out of love and not fear. We keep the commandments because we love others, therefore, we shall "not kill, steal, commit adultery..."

When Jesus touched on the matter of sharing, the rich man failed since he was lacking of love. True love always requires sharing: sharing time, talents and treasure. Keeping the Ten Commandments is not an end of Christian living but rather a means leading to an end which is love. As Christians, "You shall not kill, steal, commit adultery..." just spare us from punishment; however love and sharing lead us to heaven. Let us live the spirit of the law and not the letter of the law, in this way, we would fulfill the "the lacking in one thing". Fr. Joe Pham.

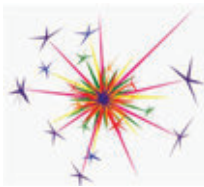

Sparks: grades 3-5

Ignite: Grades 6- 8

Ignite is our junior youth group, open to students in 6th, 7th and 8th grade. Ignite meets on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month from September through June at St. John Vianney in the Fr. Szolack Center from 5:30-6:30 PM (masks are optional but strongly recommended for anyone unvaccinated, we will have hand sanitizer available and will practice social distancing). This will give people time to arrive after the 4PM Mass at St. Margaret Church. The first meeting will take place on Sunday, September 13th. Meetings will include prayer, snacks, icebreakers and energizers, and small and large group activities, all in the context of faith and fun. Ignite members will have opportunities for service projects and volunteer work throughout the year.



Ablaze: grades 9-12

Ablaze is the group for those in 9th-12th grade. Ablaze meets on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month beginning September 19th at St. John Vianney in the Fr. Szolack Center from 5:30-6:30 PM (masks are optional but strongly recommended for anyone unvaccinated, we will have hand sanitizer available and will practice social distancing). This will give people time to arrive after the 4PM Mass at St. Margaret Church. All those in High School are welcome to join. Meetings will include prayer, snacks, icebreakers and energizers, discussions and activities, all in the context of faith and fun. Service and participation in diocesan youth events are also part of the program.
