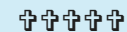

PRO-LIFE

Catholic Doctrine states that *"Human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves the creative action of God and it remains for ever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one can under any circumstance claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being"* ("Donum vitae," 5).

The *NJ Reproductive Freedom Act* is a radical NJ abortion bill being pushed to preempt the possibility of a US Supreme Court overturning of the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* Decision on **12/1/21** through the *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* case. This challenge is to Mississippi's law restricting most abortions after 15 weeks of pregnancy, where the court will decide the question of whether all state abortion bans pre-viability are unconstitutional. "**Viability**" is the court's legal standard from 1973, regarded as *the point at which an unborn child can survive outside the womb*.

This NJ Act (Gov. Murphy wants it passed by 12/2021) mandates:

- abortions by non-physicians in an office setting, past 14 weeks of pregnancy, (which was just approved by the NJ Board of Medical Examiners).
- making all abortions, including late term abortions and infanticide, a "fundamental right." Also exempts prosecution for those who commit infanticide.
- babies capable of pain having no rights at any stage of pregnancy, *even if viable and at full term*.
- deleting the "Parental Notification for Abortion Act" (for minors getting parental consent for an abortion), and restraining future legislatures from passing laws, against parental notification of a minor's abortion, even if NJ voters are against it.
- subverts (invalidates, prohibits...) NJ voters from deciding what abortion laws can be enacted should *Roe v Wade* be overturned

POPE FRANCIS NEEDS YOUR HELP FOR THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS

A Synod simply means “Meeting”. Pope Francis has asked Bishops around the world to prepare for the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in 2022 – 2023. This XVI Synod will ultimately discuss the synodal nature of the Church. Rooted in the concept of the “sense of the faithful” among the members of the Church,

Pope Francis wants to further broaden the consultation for the Synod of Bishops by inviting the faithful throughout the world to listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit in their experience of the Church. At the same time, he hopes this worldwide consultation will “form” the people in the synodal process – giving all the faithful a voice – and increasing their **participation** in the life of the Church, deepening their **communion** with the Church and helping them to live out the **mission** of the Church.

The primary goal of the synod is to help the Church become more synodal.
