## Annual Pulpit Talk, September 24 & 25, 2022

We would like to thank Father Pham for his support of our ministry and for allowing us to speak with you at mass this weekend, as we celebrate the Feast Day of St Vincent, who had a passion for helping the poor way back in the 1600's. Poverty and hardship can still arrive suddenly and with no warning. Most of our neighbors in need don't want to ask for help, and the calls to our phone line are filled with I'm not sure if you can help me but...

Serving the poor is never from a lack of generosity as Infant Jesus Parish proves to us year in and year out for the past 35 years! Our works are supported by your monetary donations, along with weekly food donations, and special collections throughout the year.

And while financial assistance is **very** important, it is even **more** vital to serve personally, showing our neighbors that God has not abandoned them, even in their darkest hours. He sends us to serve, to comfort, and to pray with our neighbors in need.

No work of charity is foreign to the St Vincent de Paul Society.
