Dear Sisters and Brothers of Infant Jesus Family,

This Sunday our Parish celebrates one of our Patron Saints, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. St. Margaret was born in France in 1647. She joined the Sisters of the Visitation where she received mystical revelations. She loved Jesus in a special way by devoting her whole life to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, this devotion later spread throughout the Church. She died on October 17, 1690.



According to St. Margaret, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus renews the effects of our redemption. From the Heart of Jesus, an endless stream of mercy is flowing for sinners. Jesus' infinite mercy is beyond what the human mind can imagine. Even the bad angel, Satan, got jealous and disagreed with God's mercy for humanity from the beginning. His endless mercy for sinners cost him his humiliating and painful death on the cross. The most painful thing that makes the Sacred Heart of Jesus bleed is when we sin or go astray. We are begging Jesus to treat us with his infinite mercy; whereas, to others, we want Jesus to treat them in our egoistic and selfish human way. Recognizing this hurt from the Sacred Heart, St. Margaret devoted her whole life for the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to pray for the conversion of sinners, and to spread Jesus' endless mercy to all.

As receivers of Jesus's infinite mercy, we too must share mercy endlessly. The merciful Heart of Jesus is always redeeming and not condemning, always finding ways to fix or to rebuild and not destroy, always lifting up the fallen and not pushing them down to the bottom, always reconnecting or reuniting to the breakaway and not isolating or separating from them.

May the intercession of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque help each one of us to live Jesus' infinite mercy in our families: Be a merciful husband, wife, mother, father, son, daughter, brother, and sister. Jesus used his painful death on the cross to explain Mercy to us. St. Margaret understood it and took it to her heart, hopefully we too will do the same. -*Fr. Joe Pham*



The Purificator—a purificatory is another linen cloth, rectangular in shape that is used to wipe the chalice. It is likewise marked with a cross and ironed in a particular manner so as to fit across the top of a chalice. Along with the corporal, a purificator, which may have absorbed the Precious Blood, are purified by being soaked in the sacrarium (a special sink in the sacristy that drains directly into the earth instead of the sewer system). After having been soaked, they may be machine washed and then ironed by hand.

#### Preparation of the Chalice

The ciboria and hosts are placed adjacent to the corpraying: by the mystery of this water and wine, may we that offers the bread and wine. come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbles himself to share in our humanity. Water, a divine gift, here represents Christ who, by the mystery of the Incarnation, joined in our humanity, represented by the wine-a work of human hands.

This ritual dates to a time when water needed to be added to the wine which was stored in concentrated form so as to make it drinkable. As with many practical things in the Liturgy, the action was given religious meaning.

#### Prayers of the Priests Over the Gifts

After the deacon, or the priest himself, has prepared the chalice, the presider quietly prays over the ciborium or paten: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life. 




