Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's Gospel Jesus gave a parable which reprimands the self considered righteous Pharisee who despised others:

"The Pharisee took up his position and spoke: O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity- greedy, dishonest, adulterous, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole



income. But the tax collector stood off at a distance, and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed: O God, be merciful to me a sinner." (Luke 18:9-14).

What the Pharisee needs to do in order for his prayer to be heard is a spiritual transformation, the transformation from pride to humility. What he has already done was very good: "Fast twice a week, pay tithes on whole income, not greedy, dishonest, or adulterous." However, that is only the beginning of his spiritual journey, he must try to reach his destination: "God be merciful to me a sinner". First of all, he forgot that he deserved to be condemned to eternal damnation from the beginning of his existence; therefore doesn't matter how much good things he does or how righteous he is, in the eyes of God, he is still a sinner who needs God's mercy and compassion. Secondly, since his pride blinded him to recognize his own sinfulness and weakness, he therefore failed to show mercy and compassion for others.

The parable today is also speaking to all of us in a greater or lesser degree, we are all in the same "boat" when it comes to sin and grace. All are sinners, all make mistake, all needs God's grace, mercy and forgiveness, only Jesus's suffering, death, and resurrection made us righteous in the eyes of God and not our own merits. Indeed, pride is the remnant of the original sin in human heart which blinds us to see God's merits and blessings in our lives, it desensitizes our sense of gratitude to God and our sensitivity to others' downfalls and weaknesses. By reflecting on the Gospel today, maybe we too need a spiritual transformation and journey, the transformation from pride to humility, a journey from death to life. -*Fr. Joe Pham*

#### Lift Up Your Hearts

give thanks. The word Eucharist is derived from the Greek, meaning "to give thanks". The series of prayers that follow this dialogue are central to the action of the Mass, but are all too often "missed" by those gathered whose minds tend to drift as the priest prays.

#### Hutzpah!

Before looking at the parts of the Eucharistic Prayer, it is important to know that they are derived from the traditional Jewish table prayers recited at the Passover and at the weekly Sab-






