#### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Tuesday November 1<sup>st</sup>, the whole Church will celebrate the Feast of All Saints. Historically, this Feast was originated in Rome. There was a pagan temple in Rome called the Pantheon, and this temple was dedicated to the service and veneration of all the pagan deities. After the



downfall of paganism, the Christians took possession of the temple, and later, Pope Boniface, in 607, dedicated this temple to the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the Saints. In due time, the Pope deposited a number of relics of the martyrs in this church, and eventually, the Feast of all Saints emerged and is celebrated annually.

Liturgically, the Church chooses November 1<sup>st</sup> to commemorate the Feast of all Saints. The Saints are the glory of the Church because they are the evidences of her sanctity. The Church has always honored them in a special manner. Their names, their lives, their relics have been the objects of veneration. Throughout the history of the Church, the Christians everywhere have invoked the Saints, trusted in them, and believed that their prayers would merit an abundance of graces.

The Saints are the heroes whose deeds are worthy, not only of praise, but also of imitation. Recently Pope Francis canonized St. Mother Teresa as a Saint of our time. Her whole life was centered on God's love and compassion for humanity. She drew her strength from the fountain of God's loving grace which empowered her to do what she did for the poor, the abandon, the sick, the orphan, and the broken. Her whole life was all about co-passion or sufferwith the suffering, she was able to see what we often don't see: the suffering Jesus in others.

Let each one of us pray to St. Mother Teresa to help us see what she saw, to love what she loved, and to do what she did so that someday our names will be written in the Book of the Saints in heaven. -Fr. Joe Pham
