Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



There are a couple of things in today's Gospel which should be taken to heart for reflection. This Gospel is about the story of Lazarus who was dead for four days in the tomb but was restored back to life by Jesus.

When Jesus was at the tomb, the first thing he said: "Take away the stone." Why did he say that? He could raise the dead to life but could not move the stone himself? Absolutely that is not the case. However, Jesus' purpose of raising Lazarus from death to life is not meant just for this "earthly life" but rather it is essentially meant for the "spiritual life." If it was meant only to raise Lazarus from his "physical death to life", then Jesus would not have asked them to remove the stone from the tomb—he would have done it himself. However, when asking someone to remove the physical stone which closed Lazarus' tomb, Jesus also signified the spiritual implication of the "stone" of selfishness, hatred, resentment, or hardheartedness which closes one's heart and mind from being receptive to God's Word and being healed, touched, restored, and transformed by his transforming power in the Sacraments.

After the stone was removed, Jesus then called Lazarus by name: "Lazarus, come out!" This also has a spiritual significance which signifies the Sacrament of Baptism. At Baptism, we were called by name, "Mary or Joseph, I baptize you" "ö, to come out of the "tomb" of original sin, to be raised back to new life in Christ.

Unfortunately, due to our sins, we return and be buried in the "tomb" again after being raised from Baptism just like Lazarus who also later died again. However, the problem is not about being buried in the "tomb" again through sin—but rather it is about the willingness to remove the "stone".

As we come to the end of Lent, are we willing to remove the "stone" which closes our hearts to Jesus' voice, who is constantly calling us to "come out" of the "tomb" and being raised up to new life? *-Fr. Joe Pham*


