

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
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

## St. Margaret Parish History

#### **Father McKeever**



Never was the need for a new parish more sorely felt in the Woodbury area than in the late 1950's. Many new housing developments were being completed and a large percentage of these new Gloucester County residents were Catholic. It was decided that the existing facilities of St. Patrick's Parish in Woodbury and the Church of The Incarnation in Mantua could not absorb the influx. Since property had been purchased in Woodbury Heights, in parish, the Church of St. Margaret Mary, was conceived, and formally incorporated on January 21, 1960. The first trustees were Michael Reitenberger and William Murphy.

The parish of St. Margaret Mary was established on June 10, 1961, by order of His Excellency, Archbishop Celestine J. Damiano, Bishop of the Diocese of Camden. There came to the parish in that first year a man all would come to know well, respect, and love over the course of his twelveyear pastorate. This was Father William L. McKeever, St. Margaret's first pastor. When the parish was first established, temporary arrangements were made to hold Mass on Sundays in the Wood Theatre in Woodbury. After six months, these facilities were no longer available. Through the kindness of Monsignor Paul Fairbrother, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Mass was held in the cafeteria of St. Patrick's School in Woodbury.

In December, 1961, the present rectory on Beech Avenue was purchased. With the help of the men of the parish, a two-car garage was converted into a chapel where morning Mass could be celebrated. Many of the furnishings in the rectory were acquired with green stamp books, which were contributed by members of the Parish.

In June of 1962 groundbreaking took place for the construction of the first building of the parish complex. This building was to consist of a multipurpose hall and eight classrooms. Less than a year later, the work had been completed. On Saturday night, February 18, 1963, the first parish social was held in the new hall. A benefit performance was given by the Woodbury Chapter of the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America. No sidewalks had as yet been constructed and wooden planks were laid in the mud to gain access to the new building.

In 1978 under the guidance of Msgr. Budney, St. Margaret's Church was built. In the back of the church is a chapel for smaller Mass events. (The chapel is now referred to as Our Lady of Guadalupe Chapel.)

In 1999, a new Ministry Center and 4 new classrooms, dedicated to Monsignor Felix M. O'Neill who was the Pastor at that time, were added to the school building. The Ministry Center has 3 rooms that are used for parish ministry meetings. The Religious Education office is also located in the Ministry Center. Reverend Calogero N. LaVerde (2000-2009) and Reverend Joseph T. Szolack (2009-2010) were the last two Pastors of St. Margaret Parish.





# Saint John Vianney Parish History

St. John Vianney Parish began in 1914 when Mass was celebrated in a private home. Masses were moved in 1929 to a newly constructed church known as "St. Agnes Parish" which became a mission of St. Teresa Parish in Runnemede.



In 1936 the church fell prey to fire and was destroyed. Construction of the present day church was completed in 1939 under the leadership of Fr. Joseph Fritz, the pastor of St. Teresa Parish.

On July 13, 1946, Bishop Eustace established St. Agnes Parish naming Father Martin D. McMahon as the first pastor. As of 1955, St. Agnes Parish was

the only Catholic Church in Washington, Gloucester, and Deptford Townships.

In February, 1971, St. Agnes Parish moved to its new home on Coles Road. Also in February 1971, Bishop Guilfoyle established the new parish of St. John Vianney. The first pastor, Fr. Walter Reilly, revitalized the parish under the patronage of St. John Vianney and had the present rectory built.

Father Reilly left in 1975 followed by Msgr. John B. Lubicky who retired in 1993. Pastor Msgr. James J. Rynne (1993-2004) over the years made numerous improvements to the church. Fr. Timothy E. Byerley (2005-2010) had the Grotto built, renovated the church and rectory.

Currently the former rectory is being utilized as a meeting area for smaller

group meetings. As of July 1, 2016, this building was dedicated to the Pastor who was instrumental in the merger process and is now named; The Reverend Joseph T. Szolack Center.



## Infant Jesus Parish St. John Vianney and St. Margaret Parishes Merge

On April 3, 2008, The Most Reverend Joseph A. Galante, then Bishop of Camden, announced the mergers of parishes in the Diocese of Camden. Bishop Galante announced, among other parishes, that St. Margaret (Woodbury Heights) and St. John Vianney (Deptford) would merge with the primary worship site at St. Margaret. The intent of these mergers were to strengthen parish life and address many of the challenges facing the Church in the Diocese of Camden.

A Core Team (formed from members of both parishes) and Priest Convener, Reverend Joseph T. Szolack, (chosen by the Bishop) started the 15 month process of the merger. On October 19th, 2008, the Core Team was commissioned by the Bishop at St. Agnes Church.

On November 4, 2008, the Core Team had their first meeting. During the process of the merger a new name for the new parish was determined: Infant Jesus Parish. A letter was written to the Bishop with the following information: "After extensive reflection and intensive discernment, our communities request that you approve Infant Jesus Parish as the name of our new parish community and accept the Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord as our Parish Feast Day."


On December 4, 2009, the parishes of St. John Vianney (Deptford) and St. Margaret (Woodbury Hts.) received the official "Certificate of Consolidation" from the Diocese.

On January 13, 2010 the merger of St. John Vianney and St. Margaret parishes became official. The new name of the merged parish: Infant Jesus Parish. The first Pastor of Infant Jesus Parish was Reverend Joseph T. Szolack who served our parish from January, 2010 through June, 2016.

On July 1, 2016, Bishop Dennis Sullivan assigned a new Pastor to Infant Jesus Parish, Reverend Joseph L. Pham.

Today, we continue to celebrate the feast days of the merged parishes; St. John Vianney on August 4th and St. Margaret Mary Alacoque on October 16th. We also celebrate our parish feast day on the Feast of the Epiphany (January 6th).

Infant Jesus Parish flourishes with many ministries, two places of worship, and a school and community of active parishioners.

**How do I arrange for a funeral?** Most of the arrangements for a funeral are made through a funeral director. The funeral director contacts the parish for the funeral date and time. The Comforting Committee will contact the family to plan the funeral liturgy.

#### How do I get a letter of eligibility to be a Godparent or sponsor? A letter of eligibility is issued by the current parish of a potential sponsor. This letter states that the Godparent or sponsor is in good standing with the Catholic faith. If you are a member of Infant Jesus Parish, please call 856-848-0047 or email your request to: theinfantJesusparish@comcast.net.

What are the requirements for a sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation? A Catholic Godparent or sponsor must be a practicing Catholic; have received the three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist); be at least 16 years old (or have approval of pastor); and if married, the marriage must have been approved by the Church. Parents may not be Godparents or sponsors. One of our priests would be happy to help in any of these matters.

**How do I obtain a Mass intention?** Contact the rectory during regular office hours. The donation for an announced Mass is \$15.00. (The date and time are published in the church bulletin.) The donation for an unannounced Mass is \$10.00. (Unannounced Masses are offered privately,)

- How does my organization reserve a room and get an event on the parish calendar and in the bulletin? Contact the rectory during regular office hours. The calendar is done on a fiscal year basis. Calendar dates are requested in July for September through June. Please contact Sharon Sandone for calendar concerns. Infant Jesus Parish utilizes all our facilities for parish functions. We are unable to rent our facilities to the public.
- My family is Catholic, but my child or I never received Baptism, Holy Communion or Confirmation. What can I do? Contact the parish office at 856-848-0047. You will be directed to either the Religious Education or RCIA Office (or both depending upon age) to begin the process.
- I was raised either as a non-Catholic, Christian or as a non-Christian and would like to talk about becoming a Catholic. What should I do? Contact Fr. Joe Pham ext. 106 at 856-848-0047. He will schedule a meeting with you to discuss the process according to your circumstances.
- My spouse and I were married outside the Catholic Church and would like to have our marriage "blessed" (i.e. convalidated) by the Church. What should we do? If one or both of the spouses is a Baptized Catholic, then the Church normally requires that the wedding ceremony be celebrated in the Catholic Church by a properly delegated officiant. Contact one of the parish's clergy through the office (856-848-0047) to discuss your unique circumstances.
- My spouse or I were previously married and are divorced or - I am currently single and am divorced. Do I have to seek an annulment? If so, how? Such situations can be more or less complex depending on circumstances. The first step is to talk with one of the parish priests who can advise you in your case. Many times it is easier than one believes. Contact the parish office at 856-848-0047 to schedule an appointment.

## Sacraments at Infant Jesus Parish

### **Contact the Parish Office:**

Information concerning the preparation and celebration of each of the Seven Sacraments can be obtained by initially contacting the parish office at 856-848-0047. You will be directed to the appropriate office to work out the details as needed. Some of the arrangements are made through the parish staff, and others are coordinated with the parish clergy. The clergy are always available to talk if you have specific questions.

### **General Information:**

Each of the Seven Sacraments are outward signs instituted by Jesus to give us sanctifying grace. They are tangible ways for individuals to receive God's redemptive love and to come to share in His divine life. They also enable the faithful to respond to God's love personally as His disciples and corporately as His Catholic Church.

On the one hand, each Sacrament requires sufficient preparation in order to be celebrated fruitfully. On the other hand, Sacraments should never be unnecessarily delayed. The appropriate time to receive each respective Sacrament ordinarily coincides with the various stages of life and its significant moments beginning from birth until progressing to death.

But it is never too late to receive Sacraments. God invites everyone to receive the outpouring of His love and to share in His divine life through the Sacraments—even adults and those brought up in other Christian denominations or without a Christian upbringing. Simply contact the parish office as noted above for more details. Information regarding specific Sacraments is as follows:

### **Baptism**:

Infant Jesus Parish celebrates the sacrament of Baptism each Sunday at Saint Margaret Church, Woodbury Hts. (immediately following the 10:00 AM Mass) or Saint John Vianney Church, Deptford (immediately following the 11:30 AM Mass).

Parents must attend a Baptism Prep Class. Baptism Prep Classes are from 10:00 AM-12:00 Noon. (Usually the 3rd Saturday of the month.) Please be sure to call the Parish Office (856-848-0047) and register to attend an upcoming Baptism class. At least one sponsor must be Catholic, and a letter of eligibility must be given to the parish prior to the Baptism. See FAQs for more details. For information on the Baptism of older children and adults, see FAQs.

#### **Penance/Confession:**

The frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged as an essential part of discipleship and vibrant spiritual life. Accordingly, at Infant Jesus Parish, we make every effort to make the Sacrament as widely available as possible, as follows: Saturdays from 9:00-9:30 AM and 2:30-3:30 PM at St. Margaret Church, Saturdays from 5:15-5:45 PM at St. John Vianney Church.

First Penance is prepared through our Religious Education Office. For more information, please call 856-845-5251. If you need to receive the Sacrament of Penance at a time not listed, please call the Parish Office at 856-848-0047 to make an appointment with an available priest.

#### **Holy Communion:**

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental Confession *except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity to receive the Sacrament in a reasonable timeframe.* In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible. (cf. *Code of Canon Law*, canon 916)

If you are a parishioner who is unable to attend Mass and would like Communion brought to you, please contact the Parish Office at 856-848-0047. The clergy will distribute Communion to parishioners who are homebound on the first Friday of the month upon request. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion bring the Eucharist at other times.

First Holy Communion for children is usually scheduled for the first Saturday in May through the Religious Education Program at 856-845-5251. It is important to note that preparation is a 2-year process. Please check the bulletin for any changes. For information concerning older children and adults, see FAQs.

### **Confirmation:**

Preparation for 8th Grade Confirmation is done through our Religious Education Office (856-845-5251). For information on the Confirmation of teens and adults, see FAQs.

#### **Holy Matrimony:**

Between the Baptized, the marriage of a man and woman is elevated by Jesus to the dignity of a Sacrament, Holy Matrimony. As such, the celebration of Holy Matrimony is a sacred act and is properly celebrated in a Church. To be valid, it must be celebrated according to the canonical form of the Church, which includes a properly delegated Catholic priest or deacon as officiant and two other witnesses (usually the best man and maid of honor). By means of this Sacrament, God consecrates the love of a man and woman and makes it an ongoing source of grace and growth in holiness.

Preparation to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony requires a commitment of time, which includes several meetings with clergy and an approved Pre-Cana class. The preparation process for your wedding should begin as soon as a couple becomes engaged, even if that is more than a year before the proposed wedding date. This will give couples an adequate and less stressful time to prepare for the details of the wedding celebration and to reflect more deeply and prayerfully upon your upcoming marriage. Please call the Parish Office at 856-848-0047 for more information.

### Anointing of the Sick:

Times of sustained sickness, serious surgery and the difficulties that inevitably accompany advance age can be a cause for both physical and spiritual suffering. Jesus knew this well, so He gave His faithful a Sacrament to strengthen and sustain them in union with His own suffering on the Cross. As a Sacrament of Healing, the Anointing of the Sick helps one to grow in holiness through sickness so that even as the body weakens one's soul is greatly strengthened.

The Anointing of the Sick is best celebrated while a person is still alert and of sound mind. It is often accompanied by the celebration of Confession and the reception of Holy Communion. The Last Rites; Viaticum and the Apostolic Pardon, which carries with it a plenary indulgence; are added to the celebration only as death grows near. If you need the Anointing of the Sick, please contact the Parish Office at 856-848-0047.

### **Holy Orders:**

The Lord calls us in many different ways. Holy Orders is a Sacrament through which deacons and priests are conformed to Jesus to share more fully in His saving work of teaching, sanctifying and serving in charity. Those called to the Religious Life as either a brother or sister are specially consecrated to God so as to live out more fully the graces of Baptism as a sign and inspiration for all Christians and people of good will.

## Time, Talent & Treasure

Sharing our time with God and His community: All time is God's time, so time can be reasonably looked at as life itself. The time we have been gifted with in order to become Disciples of Jesus. As with all God's gifts it is ours to use, not to keep. We are accountable for how we use our lives/God's time. Knowing we are accountable for how we use the time given us by God, what in our ordinary daily routine, could we do differently to acknowledge God's gift to us? Everyone has time; it is a manner of how we use that time as Stewards of this Gift. Catholic Christians are to live our lives growing in both faith and understanding that every decision we make is made within God's time; every choice and every action.

In liturgy, the Mass we celebrate is our participation in the Paschal mystery of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. Not another or different Mass but a re-presentation of the sacrifice of Jesus which is our salvation. St. Paul teaches us, "It is not I who live, but Christ who lives in me." If it is Christ who lives in me, then I am to live His life as He lived it, always in union with the Father and giving glory to God in everything I do.

Looking at life this way, challenges us to be constantly open to doing God's will in everyday events and relying more and more closely on God's guidance in how to respond. Sharing Talents with God and His community: We are made in the image and likeness of God. The Holy Spirit dwells in each of us as Baptized Catholic Christians. We have received gifts from God that are ours alone to use. No one else, even those who have been given similar gifts, can do the work God has for us to do. Everyone has talents; it is a matter of how we use that talent as Stewards of this Gift.

Sharing our Treasure with God and His community: A charity that comes from love of God cannot be separated from our acting justly. Our work/ labor provides for self and family and must be joined in charity/love to others. No member of the lay faithful is to relinquish/avoid participation in public life. Consider these questions: In my continuing development as God's people has my return kept pace or remained the same? Does my offering to God come in equal proportion from all my gifts? Where do I draw the line in my giving back to God?

Sacrificial giving means giving the "first fruits", not the leftovers (do you give off of the top? or after everything else is paid?). There is a personal need of each Christian to give ('the need of the giver to give'). This won't happen unless it is planned. Experience the joy that comes to those who give God the first share of their time, talents and money as a way of expressing their gratitude and trust in God. It is important that there is a balance in the giving of all three ... time, talent and treasure.

There are several ways to donate to Infant Jesus Parish.
